Turtles - Secrets of the Shell

Turtles – Secrets of the Shell is a traveling exhibit developed by the National Mississippi River Museum & Aquarium in Dubuque. Thanks to funding from a Resource Enhancement and Protection Conservation Education Program (REAP-CEP) grant, portions of the exhibit are now traveling to nature centers throughout Iowa.

The turtle exhibit is the fourth traveling exhibit we've hosted in recent years. Many of you visited the *Lions in Iowa!*; *Salute to Songbirds*; and *Prairies – Past, Present and Future* traveling exhibits that were also sponsored by REAP-CEP funding. We hope you will also visit this informative, hands-on exhibit that explores the wonderful world of turtles.

Turtles – Secrets of the Shell will be open during Nature Center hours beginning **February 16 through May 8, 2016**. We invite you to check out the many panels and displays including a scenic turtle statue created by Dubuque artist Isabelle Kirkendall. Visitors can hold a turtle skull, fossilized shell fragment, or view our live resident box turtles. Younger visitors may sit on a replica tortoise or crawl inside a shell and have their photo taken.

Turtles belong to the order Testudinata, one of four orders of living reptiles. Turtles are ancient creatures, yet modern turtles retain many features of the earliest reptiles. Recent fossils found in China date to 220 million years ago. These early turtles lived in the sea and had a fully formed plastron or bottom shell but a poorly developed carapace or top shell. They also had a full set of teeth! Its scientific name, *Odonto-chelys semitace*, describes them well, “toothed turtle with half a shell.”

One of the goals of the exhibit is to draw attention to conservation challenges facing Planet Earth's 260 species of turtles, including 120 species that are now listed as endangered or threatened with extinction. Here in Iowa, home to 13 turtle species, Yellow Mud Turtles and Wood

Turtles are endangered while the Blanding's, Common Musk, and Ornate Box Turtles are threatened. Ornate Box Turtles reside in portions of the Loess Hills. Visitors will have several opportunities to learn more about turtles in some upcoming programs at the Dorothy Pecaut Nature Center.

On Thursday, February 18 join us for an Open House from 5:30 to 7:30 pm to celebrate the exhibit opening. You be able to view the exhibit, meet the Nature Center's live turtles, make a turtle craft and enjoy a snack.

On Sunday, February 28 at 2:00 p.m., take an armchair journey to the Galapagos Islands and see incredible images of the Giant Galapagos Tortoise and the Green Sea Turtle. These are just a few of the photos that will be shared during this program presented by Carlyn Iverson, scientific/medical illustrator and exhibit designer. The program is hosted by the Woodbury County Conservation Foundation as part of their Annual Meeting. For more on this program see page 4.

Meet several live turtles up close and personal on Saturday, March 19 at 1:00 p.m. Kenna Anderson, local animal rescue volunteer, will present Turtle Mania and share her knowledge of turtles and tortoises.

Nature Center hours are Tuesday through Saturday from 9:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. and Sundays from 1:00 – 4:30 p.m. The Nature Center is closed on Mondays. For more information on the exhibits contact the Nature Center at 712-258-0838.

Field Notes

Southwood Cabin Project Received MRHD Grant

A \$75,000 grant from Missouri River Historical Development (MRHD) awarded to the Conservation Board in October will provide nearly half the funds required for construction of two new cabins at Southwood Conservation Area near Smithland.

The addition of cabin facilities at Southwood has been a long range goal. Two cabin units will be constructed across the road from the shower/restroom facility near the campground. The cabins will be one-bedroom units with bathroom/shower, fully equipped kitchen and living room area, open porch, and will sleep up to six adults. Furniture will be crafted from local red cedar trees by a local cabinet maker.

Cabins will be available for rent during the park season with opening planned for May 2016.

Site grading has been completed and work has progressed on rocking the access driveways despite recent heavy rains and snow. Foundations will be installed soon with both units enclosed in January.

Watch for announcements next spring regarding the grand opening and rental availability of the cabins.

The Conservation Board wishes to especially thank MRHD for their financial support to make this project possible!

Stub Gray Shooting Range News

Activity at the Stub Gray Shooting Range at Little Sioux Park has been steady since reopening the end of August. Users have been taking good care of the newly refurbished facility. Comments received have been very positive and appreciative of having the range open once again to the public.

Daily use permits (\$10) are available on site and Annual Permits (Individual or Family) can be obtained online through a link on the Conservation Board's website (www.woodburyparks.org). Annual permits are only \$50 and are good through all of 2016.

Six volunteer Range Safety Officers have been certified and equipped and will be spending time at the range at random times to answer questions, ensure compliance with range rules and assist users as necessary.



Scientific Illustrator

On Sunday, February 28 at 2:00 p.m., take an armchair journey to the Galapagos Islands, the birthplace of Darwin's Theory of Natural Selection! Carlyn Iverson, shares images and anecdotes from her time on-board a living National Geographic scientific research expedition ship. During the 2 months of the expedition, Carlyn captured over 10,000 images of the extraordinary life of the flora and fauna that are found on these exotic islands... both terrestrial and aquatic. See some of her favorite images from this trip, learn about the evolutionary botany and biology from this breathtaking corner of the world, and become a virtual traveler through her incredible stories. Carlyn Iverson has worked as a scientific/medical illustrator for over 30 years. Camping Coupon Books Available

The Conservation Department has camping coupon books for sale. The coupon books contain ten coupons, each good for one night camping in any Woodbury County Conservation campground, and will sell for the price of \$180. This provides the purchaser one free night of camping if buying the coupon book. The coupons can be used the same as cash or check and placed in the camping registration envelope at the time of camping. Coupons can be removed from the booklet and given to friends or relatives and are good for one year from the month of purchase.

Firewood coupons will also be available in books of ten for the price of nine. Firewood is usually sold in individual bundles for \$5, and the coupons would provide a 10% discount.
