### **CABINS AT SNYDER BEND PARK AND SOUTHWOOD CONSERVATION AREA TO REMAIN OPEN YEAR ROUND**

Sioux City, IA – The cabins at Snyder Bend Park and Southwood Conservation Area will now be available for rental throughout the fall and winter seasons. The Woodbury County Conservation Board decided at their November meeting to keep the cabins at these two parks open due to numerous requests from citizens wishing to use them during the off season for hunting and fishing trips or family gatherings. The cabins at Little Sioux Park will remain closed November 1<sup>st</sup> through April 30<sup>th</sup> as usual.

Four two-bedroom family cabins are available at Snyder Bend Park near Salix, Iowa. Each cabin features two queen-size beds and a queen-size sofa sleeper in the living room, accommodating up to six adults. Cabin amenities include central heat and air conditioning, fully-equipped kitchen, full bathroom with shower, flat-screen television, Blu-Ray player, and wireless internet. Each unit has a large deck with a table, as well as a campfire ring/grill and no-freeze water hydrant outside. Two of the cabins are fully accessible and include a walk-in shower.

Two one-bedroom housekeeping cabins are offered at Southwood Conservation Area near Smithland, Iowa. Each unit features a queen-size bed in the bedroom and a queen-size sofa sleeper and twin-size bunk beds in the living room, accommodating up to six adults. Cabin amenities include heat and air conditioning, a fully-equipped kitchen, bathroom with walk-in shower, flat screen television and Blu-ray player. Both cabins are partially handicap accessible and include a paved outside space with picnic table and grill along with a covered porch area.
